All: ²Let the redeemed of the LORD say so, those he redeemed from trouble

Reader: ³and gathered in from the lands, from the east and from the west, from the north and from the south.

All: "Some wandered in desert wastes, finding no way to an inhabited town;

Reader: ⁵hungry and thirsty, their soul fainted within them. All: ⁶Then they cried to the LORD in their trouble, and he delivered them from their distress;

Reading Psalm 107: 7-15

Reader:⁷he led them by a straight way, until they reached an inhabited town. All: ⁸Let them thank the LORD for his steadfast love, for his wonderful works to humankind.

Reader: ⁹For he satisfies the thirsty, and the hungry he fills with good things. All: ¹⁰Some sat in darkness and in gloom, prisoners in misery and in irons,

Reader: ¹¹for they had rebelled against the words of God, and spurned the counsel of the Most High.

All: ¹²Their hearts were bowed down with hard labor; they fell down, with no one to help.

Reader: ¹³Then they cried to the LORD in their trouble, and he saved them from their distress;

All: ¹⁴he brought them out of darkness and gloom, and broke their bonds asunder.

Reader: ¹⁵Let them thank the LORD for his steadfast love, for his wonderful works to humankind.

Reader: ¹⁶For he shatters the doors of bronze, and cuts in two the bars of iron. All: ¹⁷Some were sick through their sinful ways, and because of their iniquities endured affliction;

Reader: ¹⁸they loathed any kind of food, and they drew near to the gates of death.

All: ¹⁹Then they cried to the LORD in their trouble, and he saved them from their distress;

Reader: ²⁰he sent out his word and healed them, and delivered them from destruction.

All: ²¹Let them thank the LORD for his steadfast love, for his wonderful works to humankind.

Reader: ²²And let them offer thanksgiving sacrifices, and tell of his deeds with songs of joy.

Reading Psalm 107: 23-32

Reader: ²³Some went down to the sea in ships, doing business on the mighty waters;

All: ²⁴they saw the deeds of the LORD, his wondrous works in the deep.

Reader: ²⁵For he commanded and raised the stormy wind, which lifted up the waves of the sea.

All: ²⁶They mounted up to heaven, they went down to the depths; their courage melted away in their calamity;

Reader: ²⁷they reeled and staggered like drunkards, and were at their wits' end.

All: ²⁸Then they cried to the LORD in their trouble, and he brought them out from their distress;

Reader: ²⁹he made the storm be still, and the waves of the sea were hushed. All: ³⁰Then they were glad because they had quiet, and he brought them to their desired haven.

Reader: ³¹Let them thank the LORD for his steadfast love, for his wonderful works to humankind.


All: ³²Let them extol him in the congregation of the people, and praise him in the assembly of the elders.

Reading Psalm 107: 33-43

Reader: ³³He turns rivers into a desert, springs of water into thirsty ground, All: ³⁴a fruitful land into a salty waste, because of the wickedness of its inhabitants.



All: ³⁶And there he lets the hungry live, and they establish a town to live in;

Reader: ³⁷they sow fields, and plant vineyards, and get a fruitful yield. All: ³⁸By his blessing they multiply greatly, and he does not let their cattle decrease.

Reader: ³⁹When they are diminished and brought low through oppression, trouble, and sorrow,

All: ⁴⁰he pours contempt on princes and makes them wander in trackless wastes;

Reader: ⁴¹but he raises up the needy out of distress, and makes their families like flocks.

All: ⁴²The upright see it and are glad; and all wickedness stops its mouth.

Reader: ⁴³Let those who are wise give heed to these things, and consider the steadfast love of the LORD.
