All: Amen.





All: 6when I think of you on my bed, and meditate on you in the watches of the night;


Pastor: 7 for you have been my help, and in the shadow of your wings I sing for joy.



All: Lord, have mercy.


Pastor: For the faithful who have gone before us and are at rest, let us give thanks to the Lord.

Pastor: Rejoicing in the fellowship of all the saints, we commend ourselves, one another, and our whole life to Christ, our Lord.


