
Pastor: In this holy season of Easter we are gathered in the name of the Father, \pm the Son, and the Holy Spirit.



All: Amen.



⁷these I will bring to my holy mountain, and make them joyful in my house of prayer;


their burnt offerings and their sacrifices will be accepted on my altar;

Pastor: Rejoicing in the fellowship of all the saints, we commend ourselves, one another, and our whole life to Christ, our Lord.


