An outcome of the RIC Committee's many events this past year has been a draft Affirmation of Welcome Statement noted below. The RIC Committee hopes that the Congregation will adopt a finalized welcome statement at the June 2020 Annual meeting.

Draft Affirmation of Welcome:

We welcome and affirm full participation by all because God welcomes all, regardless of race, culture, national origin, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, relationship or socio-economic status, addictions, physical or mental health, disability, imprisonment, age, or other circumstances that too often divide us.
